### Watts History Project Update



The Photographic Collection of the Watts History Project encompasses photographs taken throughout the history of the school from 1897 to present-day. During the past year, many rewarding hours were spent sorting and better organizing the collection. It is now stored in 12 boxes, 25 3-ring binders and includes 45 CDs with varying totals of photographs. The photographs come from a variety of sources and unfortunately in many cases came undated with subjects unidentified. They document various aspects of the school's operations along with those of the hospital and are especially rich in

images of ceremonies, transformation in uniform and other aspects of student life. Covering a wide range of activities, the photographs also comprise a visual record of the vast changes that took place in the nursing profession.

Much effort was made to identify the time period and subjects in each photograph when not previously documented. As I worked with the photographs, I also recalled fond memories of my time at the school and the many students, faculty, staff and alumni I had the pleasure of knowing. I also wondered about what brought them into nursing and their individual experiences of caring for others along with those who came before and after them. I realized even more the importance in recording their stories and the far-reaching aspects of the school. It is my hope that this aspect of the history project will continue, and that the rich collection of photographs will one day be digitalized.

# **Remembering Reba Beavers**



It is with heavy hearts that we publish this newsletter, the first since the passing of Reba Beavers in November 2020. Reba graduated from Watts Nursing School in 1968. Many of you knew her as the one 'taking the money' at the Annual Spring Banquet, but she is also known for her service to the alumni over many, many years. She served in every office at some point and volunteered to participate in projects for the school for many years.

She worked at Watts Hospital, Durham County General, Duke Regional Hospital (aka: Durham Regional Hospital) for 43 years, with 30 of those years in nursing leadership. She had a number of roles throughout her nursing career. Staff / Head Nurse on Ward R at Watts Hospital, Staff/Nurse Manager on 4-1 Telemetry at Durham County General Hospital, Nursing Informatics Specialist/Technology Educator for Durham Regional Hospital, and Operations Administrator for Duke Regional Hospital.

Reba was an early adopter of technology and was instrumental in leading our conversion from paper to electronic medical records. She was still working part-time at Duke Regional as an Operations Administrator PRN just prior to her brief illness. She is remembered for her caring approach, love of patients, Watts students, and Watts alumni. She was well known for her thoroughness, organizational skills and mentorship.

Reba was a member of Trinity Avenue Presbyterian Church in Durham. She and her husband, Joe went on a lot of trips with the Duke Blue Devils Basketball and Football teams. We have lost a special colleague, leader, mentor and friend.
