That past few months have been filled with periods of change and transition. As we continue to deal with the impact of a global pandemic, we are learning how to develop a sense of normalcy in abnormal times. Watts College of Nursing is also now fully accredited, building on the tradition of excellence established by the rich nearly 127 year history of Watts School of Nursing.

In the Fall 2021 semester our students transitioned from virtual learning to in-person learning. In December 2021 we conducted two graduation ceremonies as the final cohort of the Watts School of Nursing and the inaugural cohort of the Watts College of Nursing participated in commencement ceremonies. Most of the graduates for the Fall 2021 semester have accepted job offers in the Duke University Health System.

## **Remembering Mary Newton**





Mary McLean Newton. Class of 1947 February 22, 1927 - October 26, 2021

She became a cadet nurse at Watts Hospital. She dedicated 43 years to nursing. She was the charge nurse/nurse manager in the newborn nursery the last 38 years of her career at Watts Hospital and at Durham County General Hospital (Now Duke Regional). She retired in 1990 leaving a lasting impression on all those who knew and worked with her.

Even after retirement Mary continued to support the Alumni Association, the school, and future nurses. She dedicated the first Newborn Nursery skills lab to the school which is still used currently today.

The Newton family continues to support the school and made a donation in February for the purchase of equipment for student skills lab.

#### **Ethel Clay Price Scholarships Spring 2022**

#### **December 2021 Graduation Awards**

Beulah Owens Award: Shelby Decker (WCON) & Naomi Jaimes-Chavez (WSON)

This award was established on September 13, 1969 in honor of Miss Beulah Owens. Miss Owens graduated from the Watts Hospital School of Nursing in the Class of 1905. The recipient of the award shall be a student selected by faculty who has given distinguished service to his/her patients and gone beyond the call of duty as exemplified by Miss Owens during more than fifty years of service.

#### Burke Matthews Award: Tori Slusser (WCON) & Sonja Reynoso (WSON)

This award shall be given at each graduation ceremony to a senior student who shall be selected by the faculty of the Watts School of Nursing. The recipient of the award shall be an outstanding student who displays a genuine dedication to nursing, in addition to devotion and loyalty to the school of nursing through his/her education performance and participation in student activities. The student displays a focus on the school, organization, and extracurricular activities.

#### **December 2021 Black Banding Award**

#### Reba Beavers Memorial Award: Olivia Debellis (WCON)

This award to a rising junior who has demonstrated leadership qualities in their clinical or school performance. This is given to the student who volunteers without hesitation and gets the job done. ## Watts Happening...

- Class of 1957-Charlottte Cotten Eason-I am a 1957 graduate of Watts Hospital School of Nursing. I have always been proud of the school and feel that I received excellent training there. I think it was a wise move to switch to a BSN program. This is needed in today's medical field. I am retired now, but have many happy memories of my time at Watts.
- Class of 1966-Sylvia Scarlette Tyndall-Although I have no outstanding awards or recognition, I wanted to share my success story. I entered Watts in the fall of 1963 because I had always wanted to be a nurse, had heard Watts was one of the best schools in the country, could afford tuition and it was close to my home in Raleigh. For the next three years I was immersed in hard work and total dedication to learning the life of a nurse. I made lifelong friends and through the Watts Glee Club met my future husband. Oh the stories I could tell. At Watts I became prepared to be a Hands-on nurse, but the more important lessons were in dedication, compassion, commitment and service. I will always believe nursing is a calling, not just a profession and my time at Watts supported that. After I graduated in 1966, I had non-traditional jobs: a short stint in the UNC-CH student Infirmary, supervisor of Murdoch Center Infirmary and then entry into the world of long term care (at a time when "you work in a nursing home if you can't find anywhere else"). From 1970 until my retirement in 2012 I worked in long term care. I could never have accomplished my life's work had it not been for Watts. I chose not to pursue a degree, so I am a diploma; I believe the Watts school has retained those qualities of education through the ensuing years and hopefully into the College. In my working years I was honored to serve countless elders and families, as well as meet peer professionals and mentor hundreds of nursing assistants and young nurses. My greatest reward is to continue to have a nurse tell me "I am nurse because of you". Thank you Watts for starting me on my way.
- Class of 1972-Mary Coleman Justesen-I will be having my first granddaughter this year-probably in March. Daughter Ellen Carr (WSON 2008) is mom to be. Retirement is great and I am busier than ever. Hope we will be able to have the banquet this year.
