- Introduction of Current Alumni Association Officers presented by Susan Avent, President.
 Note: current board members are wearing a blue ribbon
- Invocation...... Melissa Murray, Class of 2000, President-Elect (at 620p)
- Dinner Buffet began at 622p (salads were on the tables by 545p)
- WSON Update...... Dr Peggy Walters (715p)
 - Introduction of Associate Director of Nursing Education, Yolanda Neal. She was selected for the Duke University Health System Friends of Nursing award in the Fall of 2018 and she has been selected by the Triangle Business Journal as a Health Care Hero in January 2019.
 - Jennifer Hawkins was recognized for her work behind the scenes for student recruitment.
 - Other faculty present tonight was also introduced by Dr Walters.
 - Reba and Susan were recognized by Dr Walters for all their recent hard work at the school organizing the storage room.
 - o The school and students are most appreciative of the alumni gift provided each semester.
 - o Jamila Belk was introduced; she is the school's business analyst.
 - At this semester's graduation, a Watts graduate from 1970, Donna McDowell White, who
 is also a NC House Representative, will be the guest speaker. We have 21 graduating
 this week.
 - Or Walters gave a summary of milestones on the journey to the BSN program. They are moving to a Student Information System (SIS –Peoplesoft) which will allow online application, and other processes that are currently managed on paper or in excel spreadsheets. The license for the BSN program (Watts College of Nursing) was received. Peggy and Jennifer were able to attend that presentation, which was a very special moment. The application for the name change was submitted to the Accrediting Bureau of Health Education Schools. The 501C application was also submitted, which is needed for future financial aid. On September 23rd at the North Carolina School of Science and Math, the school is planning an inaugural celebration. Alumni will receive an invitation in the near future. The last RN Diploma class will enter in August 2019 and graduate in 2021. The first BSN class will enter in the Spring of 2020.
 - There have been 86 graduates from WSON since our last banquet. The last two classes have had a 96% pass rate on the NCLEX. There were 34 graduates in December 2018.
- WSON History Project...... Donna Rogers and Betty Faulkner (723p)
 - Donna recognized Jamila Belk for her help with acquiring some additional pieces for the archive. They now have a picture of the Class of 1901 (2 graduates). A digital copy was acquired from the UNC archives. They have been working on correcting names on the rosters from 1895-1941. They have validated most full names and have also found some lost graduates. On display tonight are Pioneers of Nursing and the Class of 1969.
- Business Meeting (728p)
 - Susan Avent, current president, announces that are still some yearbooks available. See Susan or Reba after the banquet if you would like one of the years available. We would like to thank Donna and Betty for their support with organizing the storage/archives at the school. Thank you to all those who have supported the new graduates who are attending tonight. We re-vamped the newsletter this year with a variety of updates. The newsletter was mailed out in black and white as color was not in our budget. Color version was sent electronically via email and is also posted on the website. The alumni board has accomplished a lot this past year. After reviewing scholarship funds, we decided we

would be able to increase the amount to \$4K per semester and will be divided amongst the applicants that qualify. We are committed to supporting our students. With the help of the dues and donations from the alumni we can provide \$250 per semester to the students to use for school/student needs. We are also able to provide lunch each semester for the new freshman at the Meet and Greet, provide snacks on exam days (3-4 days per semester). We also honored our school faculty this Spring with an appreciation lunch. At the luncheon with the faculty we received some suggestions on how the alumni could support the school, faculty and students: this includes board members volunteering to proctor exams (which 3 of the board members were able to help with this semester), alumni volunteers to attend labs to act as patients, volunteer with the students when they go to the Caring House, Angels Among Us event, speak to freshman about career options, email students with encouraging words, add stories to the student newsletter from alumni. We welcome other ideas to engage and support the students and future alumni. Please check the website and Facebook group page for alumni events and staying connected with the alumni association. Board meetings are in September and February. Membership meetings are in December and May. At the last December meeting the group decided we should try a luncheon. Mark your calendars now for December 10th.

- Future of the Alumni Association discussion Many alumni and guest spoke on how Watts graduates are widely recognized across the country. One alumnus stated that we are all Watts graduates regardless of the school's name, no separation is needed, diploma vs. BSN.
